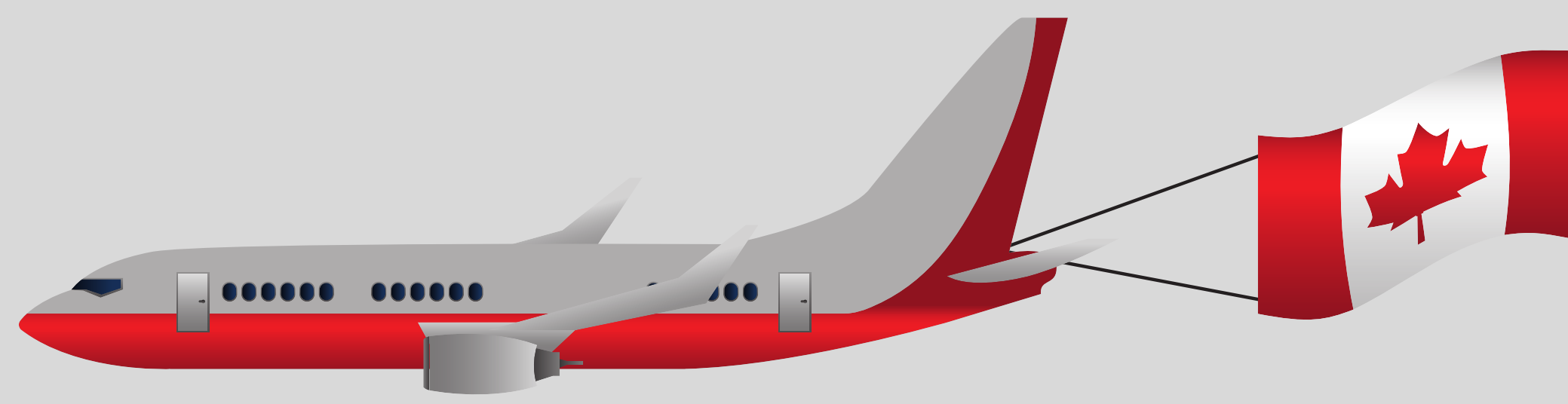

Snap a **selfie** together at the arrivals area and book a **private car** for a stress-free and romantic first ride to your hotel.

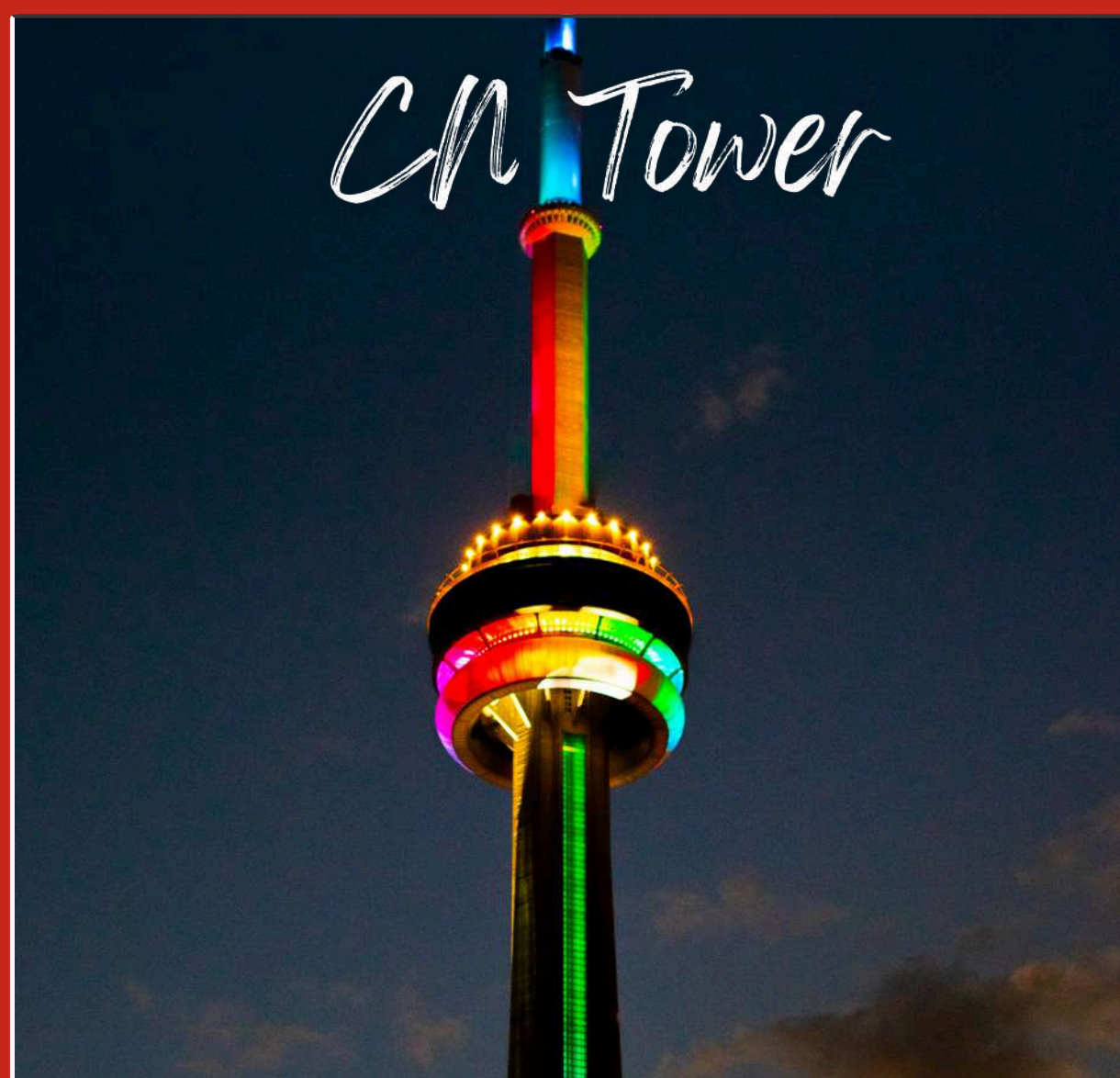


Exploring *Toronto's* Urban Pulse

Sample local delicacies, fresh produce, and artisanal foods.

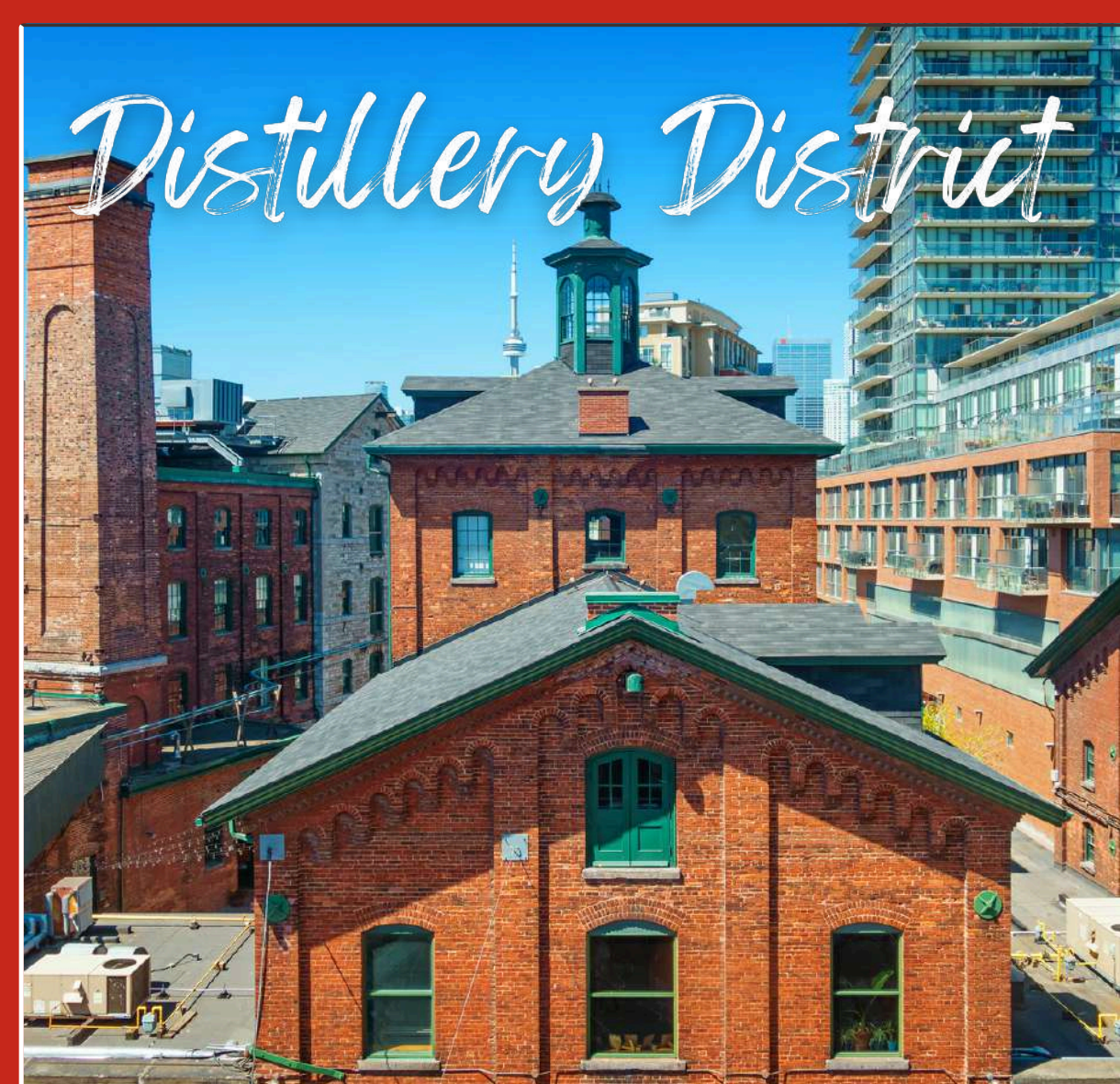
Tips For Family Trips

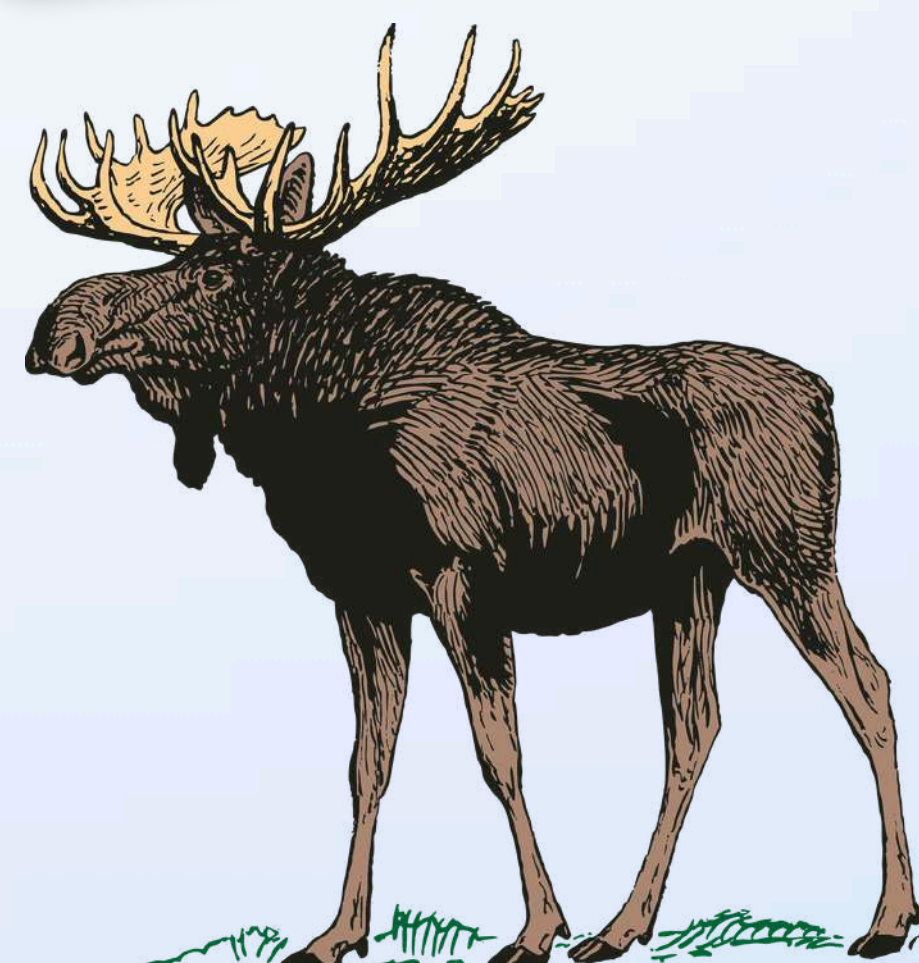
Must-Do Experiences

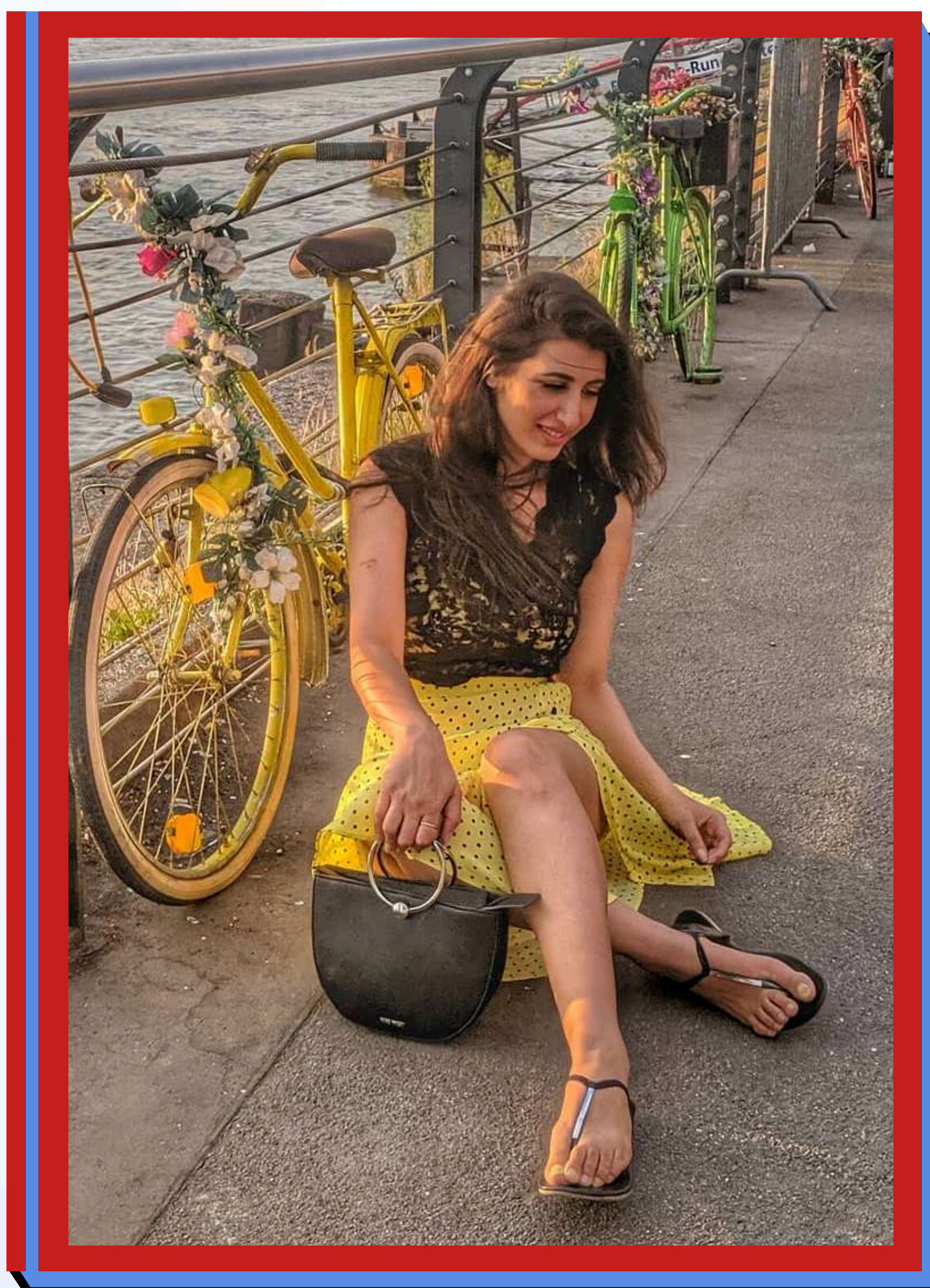
