Pack healthy snacks and small games for kids. Also include children's **medication** and a copy of everyone's health insurance details.








First Impressions Upon Arrival


Tips For Family Trips








Montreal Culture, Cuisine and Creativity



- Mount Royal Park:


 Hike or bike to the summit for panoramic city views—

Grouse Mountain:


Take the Skyride gondola for panoramic views and seasonal activities like hiking or skiing.
