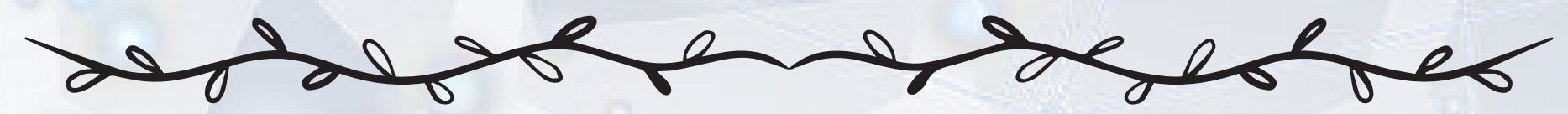


Speccial Tip from Avantika

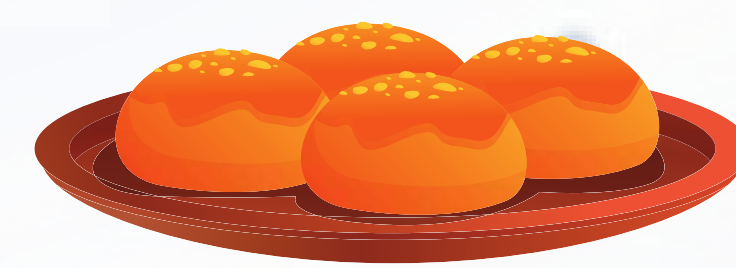

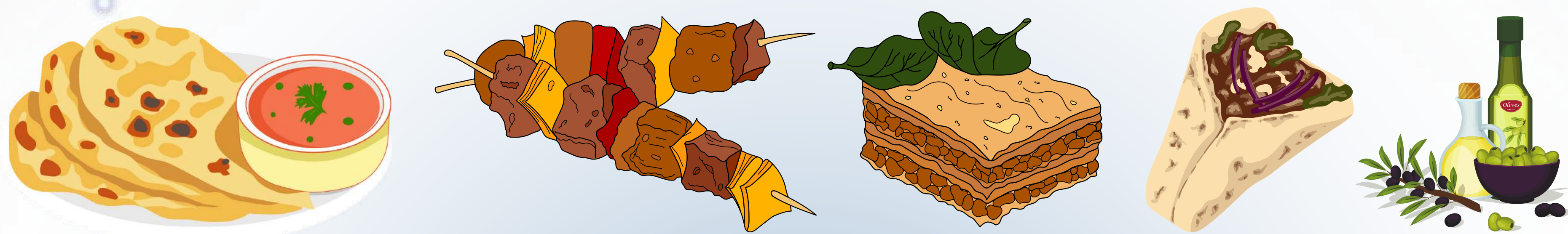
